



RULES OF THE ROAD (AND SIDEWALK).

HOW AND WHERE TO SCOOT.

- Only one person to a scooter, unless it's equipped with seating for additional riders.
- You must be 18 years or older to scoot.
- Scooters should not be operated on sidewalks in business districts.
- When scooting on the sidewalk, yield to pedestrians and give an audible signal before passing them.

PARKING YOUR SCOOTER.

- Always park scooters upright.
- Don't park scooters in a way that impedes the right of way or impede access to the right of way.
- Don't park scooters on blocks where the frontage/furnishing zone is less than 3 feet wide, or where there is no frontage/furnishing zone.
- Scooters may be parked on blocks without sidewalks if the travel lane(s) and 6-foot pedestrian clear zone are not blocked.
- SUMDs shall not be parked in the frontage/furnishing zone adjacent to or within:
 - Parklets
 - Transit zones, (including bus stops, shelters, passenger waiting areas and bus layover and staging zones, except at existing bicycle racks)
 - B-Cycle stations
 - Loading zones
 - Disabled parking zones
 - Street furniture that requires pedestrian access (for example - benches, parking pay stations, bus shelters, transit information signs, etc.)
 - Curb ramps
 - Entryways
 - Driveways
